NEWS FROM THE GARDEN

AUTUMN IN THE GARDEN

Spruce up your garden as the weather cools. Feed with an animal manure or controlled release fertilizer. Lawns will benefit from water & feeding too.

Plant for Spring Bulbs - Soil preparation is the key.

Plan for Roses - roses will still flower for some time, so feed to keep them looking good.

Plant more Trees for Autumn colour - many trees are planted in Winter, so buy now if you can. You will see the actual colour of the plants. One of Australia's leading growers, Fleming's Nurseries have a number of new trees & shrubs for release this year.

Autumn is the perfect time to sow a variety of seeds directly into garden beds. Broad Bean Early Long Pod, Snow Pea Oregon Dwarf & Pea Blue Bantam are large seeds, making them easy to grow when planted straight into the garden bed. Root Crops perform best when direct sown, so their large tap-like roots can form correctly. Carrot Harlequin, Beetroot Crimson Globe & Radish Easter Egg Mix are examples.

Sow everlasting seeds for spring colour

A GREAT RECIPE

2-INGREDIENT PANNA COTTA (taste.com.au)



- 9g sachet Aeroplane Jelly Lite Strawberry Flavour Jelly Crystals
- 375ml (1 ½ cups) boiling water
- 260g (1 cup) natural Greek-style yoghurt, plus extra (optional), to
- Fresh strawberries, halved, to serve (optional), plus frozen strawberries (optional)

Place the jelly crystals in a heatproof bowl. Add boiling water and stir until crystals are dissolved. Add the yoghurt and gently stir until well combined (stirring gently will help prevent bubbles forming). Transfer mixture to a heatproof jug. Pour evenly among 2-4 serving glasses. Place in the fridge for 3 hours or until set.

To serve, top with extra yoghurt and strawberries, if using. Or, if turning out your panna cotta, top with extra yoghurt, then use a microplane to finely grate a frozen strawberry over the top. Top with a strawberry half, to serve

The light signals back, "I'm a Seaman First Class. You must change your course, sir. " Now the Captain is mad. I'm not changing my course." The light signals back a final



PASSIONFRUIT



HOW TO GET MORE FRUIT

Passionfruit vines can flower from spring into Autumn, and if your vine is flowering, there is something you can do to maximise the harvest.

You only need one passionfruit vine to be able to grow fruit (they're self-fertile), but pollen still needs to be moved from the male part of the flower to the female part.

Bees & other pollinators normally do a good job of this but if the bees are elsewhere or the weather is rainy or overcast (which reduces bee activity) you can help improve fruit set by hand pollinating.

Using a small soft paintbrush, gently swish it around the centre of one flower and then do the same thing with another flower. The aim is to move as much pollen between as many flowers as possible. It's best done in the morning when the flowers are fully open and on multiple days,

Your brushwork will be rewarded with a bumper crop!


