# PREPARING CITRUS FOR WINTER


3 Key Autumn jobs

**Fertilise little & Often:** Every few weeks apply a few handfuls of blood & bone & pelletised chicken manure to the drip-line of each tree, stopping once winter really kicks in.

Now is the time to apply a liquid feed of Epsom salts & trace elements - critical elements that are often lacking in Peth's sandy soils.

Mulch for Winter warmth: Citrus have shallow roots that benefit from an insulating mulch. (make sure to keep it away from the trunk to avoid collar rot)

**Prune:** Lightly prune to improve airflow & remove pest-infested growth, like Gall wasp.

## **DUCHESS POTATOES**

- 2 Potatoes (not Nadine too waterv)
- 1 Egg,
- Cream or Milk
- Grated Cheese.

Cook the potatoes well, drain and mash with with the milk or cream. Add an egg and beat well. Either pipe the potato mix onto a lined baking tray or use an ice cream Scoop.

Sprinkle each one with grated cheese and bake in the oven at 180°

### LEMON & PASSIONFRUIT PIE

4 Eggs

ingredients.

- 1 cup sugar
- 100 g softened butter
- 100g slivered almonds
- 1 cup desiccated coconut
- 1 zest of 1 lemon & 1 orange
- 1 cup coconut milk
- ½ cup plain flour
- Cream or ice cream to serve
- Pulp of 3 passionfruit

Preheat oven to 180°. Place the first 8 ingredients into a food processor & blend until well combined. Poor into a buttered 28 cm pie plate & bake for 1 hr until lightly browned. Cool then refrigerate 1 hr. Slice & serve with remaining 3


