Q I have this double-headed poinsettia and each year I cut it back to the trunk, then dump the cuttings. I am wondering if you know of anyone who would like the cuttings?

A It is unusual to find the double-headed poinsettias so there would be lots of people who would like them. I would put a post on your local Facebook page and leave the cuttings out on the verge for people to pick up.

PLANT OUT RHUBARB

Winter is the perfect time to plant bare-rooted rhubarb crowns. You'll find these at nurseries, or you can start with younger potted plants if crowns aren't available.

When planting crowns, ensure they sit right at soil level.

FEED: Rhubarb needs deep, rich soil to support its taproot. Avoid pots.

Find the right spot - Rhubarb loves afternoon shade & regular water. Give them space - 80 cm apart to maintain good airflow & avoid fungus

A naturally sweet, healthy treat, perfect for snacking, topping yogurt, or adding to baked goods!

Ingredients:

Fresh Strawberries (use as many as you like.)

Instructions: Preheat Oven to 95° Wash & dry strawberries thoroughly Slice evenly - cut into thin, even slices (horizontally for better drying.) Arrange on a Baking Sheet lined with parchment paper & place slices in a single layer without overlapping. Bake Slowly 2 - 3 hrs, flipping halfway through until strawberries are dried but still slightly chewy.

Cool completely before storing in an airtight container.

Kings Park and Botanic Garden

Check out this blooming beauty ..

The Hakea orthorrhynchas in our collections are currently ablaze with striking bright red flowers, which not only look great, but provide a fantastic food source for our nectar-loving native birds.

Flowering from winter through to early spring, this plant is also known as the Bird Hakea due to the long beak on the oval woody fruits, which are an important food source for our Black Cockatoo species.

In the wild, Bird Hakeas are found between Three Springs and Shark Bay, particularly around Kalbarri. This specimen is sitting pretty outside the Kings Park Administration building on Kattidj Close, with other specimens look fantastic in the Grevillea and Hakea collection in the WA Botanic Garden.



Green waste verge collections



Green waste verge collections are starting in your area soon

Everything you need to know, including when the pick up is happening in your area, is at https://brnw.ch/21wSA19

Quick tips:

- ✓ Place your green waste in neat piles on the verge by 6am Mon of your collection start week.
- √ Waste must not be on your verge more than 7 days prior to collection.
- Ensure your waste does not obstruct footpaths, water metres, light poles, trees, etc.
- A Please check if you live in a Tree Preservation Area before doing any work in the garden.
