Daisy disguise of invasive weed

A popular garden plant sold at Bunnings and other Aussie nurseries is even more invasive and potentially dangerous to Australia's natural environment than originally thought, new research has revealed.

La Trobe scientists, writing in the Frontiers journal, warn that gazania daisies, a brightly coloured ornamental plant sold in nurseries nationwide, is a "highly invasive plant" that is beginning to impact grain production and grasslands across southern Australia.

The plant can germinate and thrive in almost all conditions, the report shows, regardless of moisture, temperature or salinity levels.

"Due to its flexible growth

requirements, gazania is now widespread and naturalised in a variety of habitats including coastal sand dunes, stream banks, wastelands, open grasslands, along roadsides and on cultivated and irrigated sites," the report states.

Bunnings continues to sell gazanias, saying it followed local biosecurity regulations.

A GREAT RECIPE

Peanut Brittle Slice

Recipe from Chris Hardie

Base

125gr. Butter & ¼ Cup Sugar Egg (1)

1 Cup Plain Flour

1/4 Cup S.R Flour & 1/2 tsp. Salt

2 Tablespoons Custard Powder.

Topping

½ Cup Brown Sugar

1 Tablespoon Golden Syrup

90 gr. Butter & 1 ½ Cups Salted Peanuts roughly chopped.

Method: Cream butter & sugar until fluffy, beat in egg, then stir in dry ingredients. Press dough into a 18 x 28 cm tin lined with baking paper, then bake in a 170 oven for 15 minutes or until just lightly browned, remove from oven.

Topping: Place brown sugar, golden syrup and butter in a saucepan, stir over a low heat until the sugar has dissolved, simmer for a few minutes (this can be done in the microwave if you choose). Stir in peanuts.

Spread the topping mixture over the base and return to the oven for about 10 minutes, when you see the topping bubble, remove from the oven, even though the topping is still runny. The topping will set when it cools. Slice with a sharp knife when cool.
