NEWS FROM THE GARDEN



Did you know **Arum Lilies** can spread by both seed & underground corms? The seed passes through birds very quickly. Thankfully the seed does not have long-lived dormancy in the soil & is only viable for 12 months

Stop Seed Set & you can stop movement.

While chemical control is most effective, one quick action can be taken now to reduce their spread:

SIMPLY SNAP OFF THE FLOWER HEADS BEFORE THEY SEED!

Cut as close to the top of the flower stem as you can - this stops developing seeds from drawing energy.

Once the flowers turn yellow & dry, seeds become viable - so remove & bin them.

Don't forget: Arum Lilies are toxic, so always wear gloves when handling them.

This easy step helps stop the next generation of weeds from spreading especially when spraying, slashing or digging out is not an option.

A GREAT RECIPE MAGIC SLICE

(Recipe provided by Chris Hardie)

Ingredients: (BASE)

125g Melted butter

1/4 cup Plain Flour

1/4 Cup Caster Sugar

Combine & press into a paper lined slice tin, bake at 170° until golden brown, approximately 15-20 minutes. Cool slightly.

TOPPING:

1 Cup Milk choc bits

1 Cup Coconut,

1 Can Condensed Milk

1 cup Raisin or Sultanas & 1 cup Flaked Almonds.

Sprinkle Choc bits, Raisins & Coconut evenly over the base, pour over condensed milk, then top with flaked almonds, bake at 170° 25-30 minutes, or until golden brown. Allow to cool in the pan before cutting.

Caution - it browns very quickly!!

MOSQUITO YARD SPRAY

How to identify plants & flowers using your Phone & Google

IPHONE

Open the Photos app on your iPhone and select a picture with a clearly defined subject, such as a flower or animal.

Check the info ("i") icon at the bottom of the screen.

Tap the little icon in the center of the photo to bring up the Lookup search results. The function can work for buildings, pets, food, plants and other things.

ANDROID

Android phone users can use Google lens similarly:

They can snap a picture, view it and tap the "Lens" feature.

This will trigger Google to show what the plant is
